How to Find Us

Arrival by public transport.

Directions from the M5

Leave the motorway at junction 30, take the first exit at the roundabout (left) and head towards Exmouth. At the next roundabout take the second exit (straight ahead) and join the A3052 which is the main road that leads to Sidmouth. Stay on the A3052 and after climbing a steep hill out of Newton Poppleford the junction (right turn) to Sidmouth is approximately 300 metres after the crest of the hill. Follow this road into Sidmouth without taking any left or right turns and you will eventually arrive at a T junction on the sea front. The Bedford Hotel is on your left opposite the public car park.

Directions from the A303

Follow the A303 until it becomes the A30. When you reach Honiton take the exit off the dual carriageway signposted Sidmouth. Turn left at the end of the slip road, left at the next T junction and right at the next roundabout. Follow this road (A375) through Sidbury to Sidford. At the traffic lights (junction of A375 & A3052) continue straight ahead across the A3052 and follow this road (B3175) until you reach the sea front at Sidmouth. Turn right and you will find The Bedford Hotel on your right at the mini roundabout.

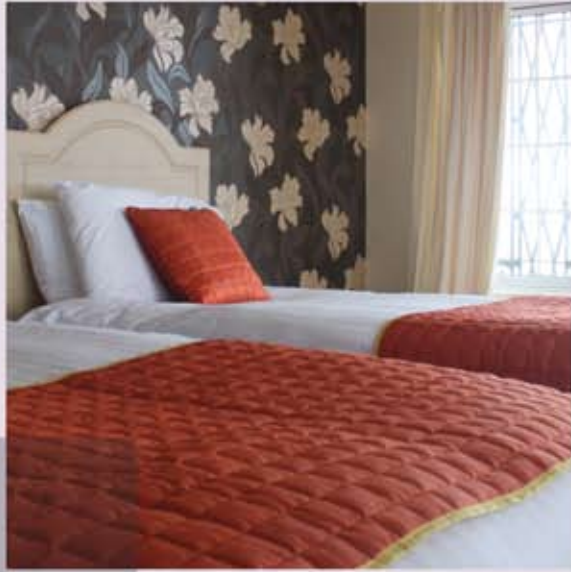

The Jewel of Devon

Situated at the mouth of the river Sid and once a popular fishing village and port, Sidmouth lies on a sheltered bay and became a popular resort for the gentry in the 1820's. Its a regency town, with all the hallmarks of that elegant period.

Surrounded by the East Devon Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, Sidmouth forms part of the Jurassic Coast world heritage site. Red cliffs flank the town and Sidmouth sits astride the south-west coastal path

which skirts most of the West Country coast of England.

Take an invigorating walk up to Peak Hill to experience the magnificent views of the sea and the coastline, where Sidmouth is spread out below. In the other direction is the equally commanding Salcombe Hill, whilst inland are the green hills of the Sid Valley. For the less energetic there are many gentle walks around the town and gardens.

The Bedford Hotel

One of the first Regency houses to be built on the seafront in Sidmouth was Wallis's Marine Library and Reading Rooms. This was the early nineteenth-century meeting place for Sidmouth's fashionable summer visitors. It's now the centre-piece of the Bedford Hotel and the pride of the Pyne family.

Located at the heart of Sidmouth's seafront means many rooms boast breathtaking panoramic views across Lyme Bay.

With the beach just in front, the town right behind and attractive gardens all around, there is much to do within easy reach of The Bedford.
